



## RULES AND PROCEDURES FOR OPDMD USE

1. Only the following types of OPDMDs are permitted:
  - a. Licensed automobiles (cars & pick-up trucks)
  - b. Vehicles typically categorized as ATVs and ORVs
  - c. Electronic personal assistance mobility devices (EPAMDs)
    - i. Segways®, electric assisted bicycles and the following electric powered devices: foot scooters, tracked mobility chairs or tricycles that are designed to transport a single individual with a disability as a substitute for walking
  - d. Electric golfcarts
2. Noise emitted by OPDMDs may not exceed 70 decibels.
3. Cars and trucks must have an exhaust system and muffler in good working order.
4. ATV's must have an approved spark-arresting muffler.
5. OPDMDs must be operated at a safe speed, not exceeding (5) miles per hour. Where other visitors are present and visible on the trail, a slower speed is recommended.
6. No OPDMD is allowed to overtake another trail user unless that trail user yields to the OPDMD operator.
7. OPDMD users must contact LTC to request usage of a particular trail system or Preserve with their OPDMD. A minimum notice of 48 hours is required to make arrangements for the use of an OPDMD.
8. Applicants must pick up a gate key at LTC office in person and attend an orientation meeting. A permit will be issued that must be displayed on the OPDMD during use.
9. The gate key must be returned within 48 hours following site visit.
10. OPDMDs must remain on designated trails, unless other arrangements have been requested and approved by LTC staff.
11. All other LTC rules must be observed:
  - a. No camping, fires, dumping, trimming or removal of tree limbs or living vegetation, permanent blinds or tree stands, or hunting on Preserves without permission
12. LTC reserves the right to deny OPDMD use to persons who violate Preserve rules.
